My family moved to Bushey when I was ten years old, and I attended Bushey Hall School (now the Bushey Academy) for all of my secondary education. I then took a degree in European Politics at the University of Kent.

Today, I work as a Railway Manager, where amongst other things, I have worked on recruitment and people management. Previously I worked in Local Government, including a short time supporting colleagues in Schools and Social Care. This has given me some useful skills that I have been able to bring into my role as a School Governor.

I have been a School Governor for nearly 10 years, starting at Bushey Meads School. When

Bushey Meads and Little Reddings became the Bushey St James Academy Trust, I became an elected Bushey Meads Trustee. In August 2013, I took over as Chair of the Trust. At this time, we were in need of new Headteachers for both schools and I coordinated the process which resulted in the recruitment of Mr Turner and Miss Simmonds to the Trust.

In November 2014, Ofsted visited Little Reddings Primary School. They agreed with Miss Simmonds that the school needed to make a number of changes in order to meet our ambition of being an outstanding school.

Central to this was Governance at the school, which needed to be brought up to date with the latest requirements. As part of this, a number of experienced Bushey Meads Governors joined the school on an interim basis to provide clarity and direction as we recruited a number of new, committed Governors. As Chair of the Trust, I took over as the Interim Chair of Governors at this point.

Soon, Ofsted will visit the school again. What they will find is a school which is transformed from just two years ago. Under Miss Simmonds' leadership, the school continues to make improvements across the board. This year, with a number of new, committed and experienced staff joining our excellent existing team, the school is poised to make further steps forward.



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For the Governing Body, we now have a team of innovative and committed individuals who bring a vast range of skills which, together, mean that we are now able to fulfil our core role as a critical friend to the school, scrutinising the policy and direction of the school, analysing and challenging results and, crucially, supporting Miss Simmonds and her Senior Leadership Team as we continue along the path towards outstanding.

I am very lucky indeed to work with a fantastic Board of Governors and to see the tremendous efforts made by staff, parents and children every day is inspiring. Together, all the Governors are dedicated to supporting everyone to make Little Reddings the best place for all of our children: learning together, respecting each other, success for all.

We receive in-house and external training from Hertfordshire, the Wroxham Learning Alliance and PiXL to name just a few. We are also lucky enough to be one of a handful of Hertfordshire schools to be

taking part in the Primary Writing Project which starts next week.
