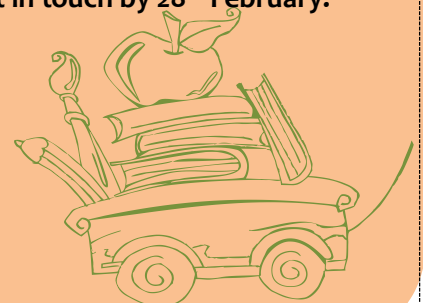
Year 5 visited Woodoaks Farm and had a fabulous time den building and finding out about dairy and meat produce as part of their 'allotment' topic.

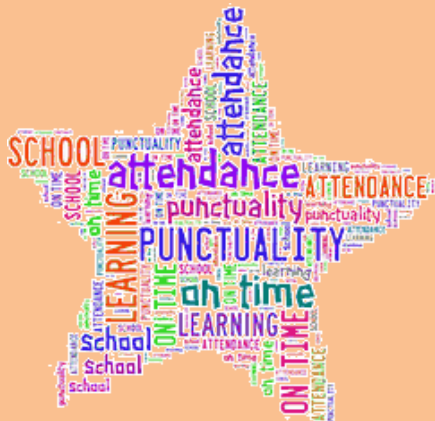
