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LRS Governors

Over the next few editions of the LRS weekly newsletter we are having a focus on the work of our fantastic governing body. The Governing Body is currently made up of 16 members and they form the Full Governing Body, who as a group meet 3 times a year for a formal 2 hour meeting.

Much of the governors' work as 'critical friends' of the school is however completed at committee level, which is where the detail of school performance and all the relevant school policies and procedures can be scrutinised carefully and shaped moving forward - all to support the positive ongoing school improvement journey.

There are three main committees and this week we are focussing on the work of the....

Teaching and Learning Committee

Areas of school life that this committee covers includes data from lesson observations completed by senior leaders in the school, professional development plans for the year to improve teaching and learning across the school, an overview of staff appraisal and their performance and a real oversight of the school curriculum. This encompasses extended school activities, home learning and the many and varied trips and visits that take place throughout the year.



In addition the committee regularly scrutinises the teaching staff and recruitment to the school and carefully reviews relevant sections of the School Development Plan. The committee completes an annual review of the provision in the school for sex education, learning about careers, RE, spiritual moral social and cultural learning, ICT, PCHE and collective worship. They also analyse the relevant areas from results of annual questionnaires.

The committee also reviews and makes recommendations in relation to the following key school policies: Collective Worship, Community Cohesion, Curriculum, Directed Time, Display, Marking and Feedback, Sex Education and Relationships, Staff Development and Teaching and Learning.

We all know that Teaching and Learning is at the heart of Little Reddings School, so the work of this key committee is crucial to the life of the school and its exciting journey towards becoming a good and outstanding school.

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Top 10 tips to help children enjoy reading

1. Make books part of your family life - Always have books around so you're ready to read whenever there's a chance.

2. Join your local library - You'll find the latest videogames, blu-rays and DVDs, plus tons and tons of fantastic books. Allow them to pick their own books, encouraging their own interests.

3. Match their interests - Help them find the right book - it doesn't matter if it's fiction, poetry, comic books or non-fiction.

4. All reading is good – Don't discount nonfiction, comics, graphic novels, magazines and leaflets.

5. Get comfortable! - Snuggle up somewhere warm and cosy with your child to read.

6. Ask questions - To keep them interested in the story - such as, 'What do you think will happen next?' or 'How do you think this character feels?'

7. Read whenever you get the chance - Bring along a book or magazine for any time your child has to wait, such as at a doctor's surgery.
8. Read again and again - Encourage your child to re-read favourite books and poems. Rereading helps to build up fluency and confidence.

9. Bedtime stories – Regularly read with your child or children at bedtime. It's a great way to end the day and to spend valuable time with your child.

10. Rhyme and repetition – Books and poems which include rhyme and repetition are great

for encouraging your child or children to join in and remember the words.

Word of the Week

Each week in school we will have a 'Word of the Week' that children will be introduced to in assembly and have displayed around the school. The idea is that staff will then challenge the children to learn the word, know its meaning and use it in context in their spoken and written work. The wider the vocabulary that children hear, read and learn - the better their Literacy will be. Please help your child with learning next weeks word, which is <u>'absurd'</u> - meaning: 'utterly or obviously senseless, illogical, or untrue; contrary to all reason or common sense;

laughably foolish or false'
