
Year 5 Newsletter 27.4.18


Year 5 were lucky enough to be in the company of Miss Jalki this week. She is currently approaching the end of her Teacher training. She has been working with groups of children from both classes to develop their maths skills, and their inference and deduction through guided reading. "I have thoroughly enjoyed learning with the Year 5 children, who have been a pleasure to work with!"

Our Beast Creator topic has fuelled the children's interest and as a result they have created their own 'leaflet-style' fact files about deadly bugs! Pupils developed their skills of considering audience and purpose for the written pieces (which is an important skill). Whilst 'hooking' the reader through effective writing techniques. Children ensured that they focussed on their individual writing targets.



Year 5 have begun a 'Maths Challenge Afternoon' on Fridays which gives every child the extended opportunity to practise and polish key skills which incorporate the 4 operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.) This will look different for different groups according to their individual targets.

By delving into our topic, children have now become experts in the life and works of Charles Darwin and have been investigating his theories. After recording facts, pupils created their own human food chain in the hall and illustrated their understanding by drawing detailed food chain diagrams.
