
## Year 5 Newsletter 29.6.18

They really impressed us with their imagination, shrewedness, and business acumen. During Maths, we have been continuing to develop our problem solving skills whilst focussing on finding fractions of amounts and dividing fractions. We are really pleased with the progress our Year 5s are making particularly in Maths. They are embracing challenges that they previously found overwealming, whilst building their confidence and resilience.
