Uniform

Attendance and Punctuality

All children are expected to be in school on time every day. If your child is unwell please contact Mrs Wyborn or the School Office to let school know. Please refer back to the whole school letter sent at the start of term which gives you instructions for Covid-19 protocol. Do not send your child to school if they are unwell or with any Covid -19 symptoms.

Home Learning

Your child will be very busy acquiring new knowledge in school and it is important for their language development to talk to them about what they have learned each day.

As time progress, we will inform you about the different skills they are mastering in school in order for you to support them with these at home as well.

The most important thing to do from today is to read a bedtime story to them every night.

Lunches and Snacks

In Nursery your child will receive a free snack daily if your child wishes to have one.

If your child is staying for the afternoon sessions, please ensure that you provide a healthy lunch and a drink for your child. The lunchboxes will be kept on the lunch trolley just outside the classroom door. Payments for the afternoon sessions is made through SIMS.

All children must come to school with a labelled water bottle every day– these will be kept in the class and your child will be able to access their bottle whenever they need to.

English

This term we will be focussing on the story 'On Sudden Hill' It is a story focussed on friendships and how to be a good friend. We will be learning new vocabulary that is linked to our class story.



We will also be working towards being able to recognise the initial letters of our names and trying to form these letters correctly. At the term progresses, we will attempt more letters in our names.

Communication and Language

Within our group times, the focus of our learning this term will be to learn and use vocabulary in order to express ourselves clearly.

This is a crucial skill for our children to master and through a variety of fun and exciting games, we will aim to rapidly broaden their understanding of spoken language.

Physical Development

We will be focussing on developing our gross motor skills during our active sessions outside. This will enable children to develop their spatial awareness as well as their hand-eye-coordination.

We will also have sessions focussed on healthy living - especially dental hygiene!



Understanding of the World

We will be focussing on the children's diverse backgrounds in order to celebrate our cultural differences and experiences. We will be looking at the children's families and what makes them special.



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

In PSHE this term, we will be focussing on forming friendships and what it means to be a good friend.

We will also be learning to adapt to our new routines and rules in class and we will have lots of class discussions on how to contribute to our classroom community in a positive way.

Maths

This term in Maths we will be singing lots of number songs to develop our understanding of numbers and we will be starting to count and recognise numbers up to 5.



Expressive Arts and Design

This term we will be focussing on large mark making (painting, drawing, cutting and sticking) and linking meaning to the marks they make. This will eventually lead to forming some recognisable letters.
